COVID-19 RESPONSE

Providing Immediate Relief to Those in Need

Food insecurity soared at the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, leaving many homeless and low-income Tenderloin residents at risk of hunger. For those struggling to get by in the inner-city, access to a consistent source of food can be a huge burden. The effects of the pandemic have left many of the Tenderloin's most vulnerable without enough to eat each day.

To-Go Meals and Groceries

City Impact has distributed over 50,000 hot to-go meals and over 37,000 grocery bags to men and women hit hardest by the pandemic since March of 2020. With a steady increase in residents needing food, we have remained committed to meeting this need so no man, woman, or child has to go hungry.

Family Grocery Boxes

Economically disadvantaged families are among those most severely affected by the pandemic. Job loss has left many parents out of options and unable to keep food on the table. During the pandemic, we have provided over 4,000 grocery boxes to families so parents can focus on getting back on their feet.

Neighborhood Meal Delivery

For residents living in low-income SRO buildings in the Tenderloin, loneliness and isolation are a daily obstacle. Shelter-in-place ordinances created even more burdens for low-income residents, including the elderly and disabled. We provide boxes of meals and groceries to an average of 5 SRO buildings each day, serving thousands of low-income residents every week.

Distance learning caused many students to fall behind academically, especially students in low economic areas like the Tenderloin. Many children did not have access to devices or wifi to complete homework assignments or to even attend online classes. We've stepped in to provide resources to students to help close the inequality gap.

After-school programming

- One-on-one tutoring for students who fell behind during COVID-19
- A safe place for kids to play while parents are away
- Access to devices and wifi to complete school work

Summer Programs

- Academic instruction to improve reading and math skills among students
- Individualized attention for children who need extra help
- A fun and encouraging community for at-risk youth
